Upturn gains momentum -

European Semiconductor Market in September 2003

The September data show a further significant improvement in the semiconductor market, providing evidence for the raised estimations of the recent 2003 market forecast by WSTS. The upturn gains momentum - not only in volume but also in units. The driving forces remain more or less the same: The most significant drivers have been PC, wireless applications and Chip Card ICs whereas the European industry has a dominant role in the World. In wired communication the downturn seems to bottom out now.

Please note: For the first time the data contain now micromechanical actuators in addition to sensors. This innovative new product category has entered a significant volume already and is expected to experience a high growth in the coming years. It adds alone an additional 1,6% growth for Europe and an additional 1,7% for the World (in comparison with last year).

European Semiconductor sales in September 2003 amounted to US\$ 2.717 billion according to WSTS, up +6.6% versus previous month. This corresponds to a +17.3% increase compared to the same month last year. Year-to-date, semiconductor sales increased by +14.1% versus the same period last year.

The exchange rate of the Euro compared to the US\$ has a very significant impact on the growth data at this time. Measured in Euro, semiconductor sales in September were EURO 2.417 billion, an increase of +8.2% versus previous month and an increase of +2.8% versus the same month a year ago. On a year-to-date basis, semiconductor sales stidecreased by -4.7% versus the same period last year.

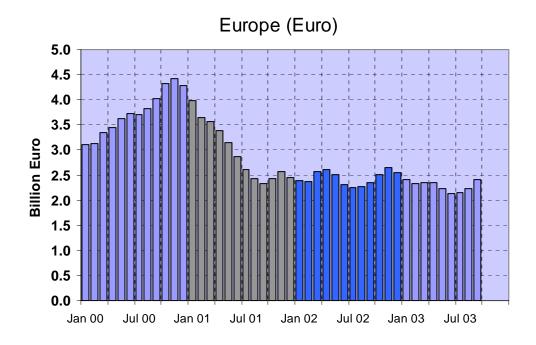
On a Worldwide basis, semiconductor sales in September were US\$ 14.441 billion, up +6.5% versus previous month. This results to an increase of +17.5% versus the same month in 2002 and on a year-to-date basis to a growth of +14.7%.

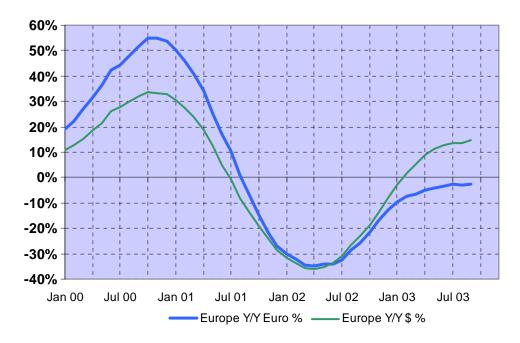
