Brussels, March 3, 2005

Slow start to the new year for semiconductor sales

Reflecting the traditional post-quarter slowdown, January has seen all regions start the new year with a negative sign compared to the December 2004 figures. Europe shows a -1.7% drop (on a 3 months average), with negative signs in a similar range or little growth also being recorded for the other regions.

Application specific (-4,9%), MOS Memory (-1,8%) and Flash are the segments which have particularly influenced this month's results. Better performance was instead recorded for MCU.

European Semiconductor sales in January 2005 amounted to US\$ 3.467 billion according to the World Semiconductor Trade Statistics (WSTS), down -1.7% versus the previous month. This corresponds to a +17.9% increase compared to the same month last year. On a year-to-date basis, semiconductor sales increased by +19.7% versus the same period in 2004.

The exchange rate of the Euro compared to the US\$ has still a significant impact on the growth data at this time. Measured in Euro, semiconductor sales in January were EURO 2.633 billion, a decrease of -3.1% versus previous month and an increase of +9.0% versus the same month a year ago. On a year-to-date basis, semiconductor sales increased by +15.2% versus the same period in 2004.

On a worldwide basis, semiconductor sales in January were US\$ 18.270 billion, down - 0.5% versus the previous month. This results in an increase of +17.5% versus the same month in 2004 and on a year-to-date basis results in a growth rate of +22.8%.




EUROPE - Monthly European Semiconductor sales in billion Euro (3-month-average data)
