Latest Semiconductor sales data, for immediate release

Brussels, April 6th, 2009

European sales of semiconductor decreased in February

European sales for semiconductor decreased by 6.9% in February 2009 compared with the previous month, the World Semiconductor Trade Statistics (WSTS) reported on April 3rd. A similar trend in sales was also observed across the other regions, with the impact of the global downturn hitting in particular Japanese sales, which decreased by 13.8%.

Slower sales were reported for most product categories. However, some categories such as Total NAND Flash Memory and MOS Digital signal processors showed a positive performance compared with the previous month, with a growth rate of 4% and 3% respectively.

Overall, European semiconductor sales in February 2009 amounted to US\$ 2.114 billion. This corresponds to a decline of 36.1% compared to the same month last year. On a YTD basis semiconductor sales declined by 33.5% in 2009 versus the same period in the year 2008.

The exchange rate imbalance of the Euro compared to the US dollar continued to impact the European sales picture. Measured in Euro, semiconductor sales of 1.606 billion Euros in February 2009 were a new record low in the decade, down 7.4% on the previous month and down 28.9% versus the same month a year ago. On a YTD basis semiconductor sales declined by 25.2% in 2009 versus the same period in the year 2008.

On a worldwide basis, semiconductor sales in February 2009 were US\$ 14.167 billion, down 7.6% versus the previous month. This results in a decline of 30.4% versus the same month in 2008 and on a YTD basis it results in a decline of 29.2%.

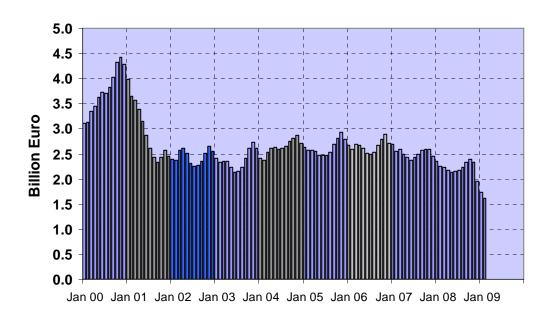

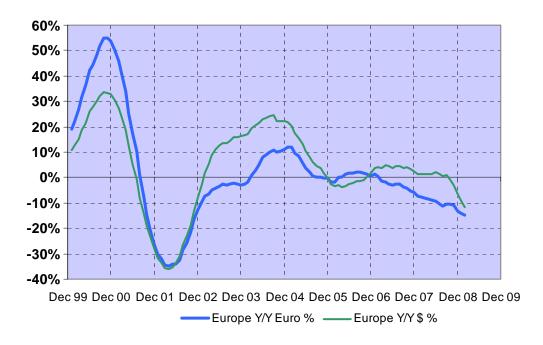
EUROPE - Monthly European Semiconductor sales in billion Euro (3-month-average data)
